North African Queer Film Festival / Bouchra, QC

The North African Queer Film Festival (NAQFF) is organized and curated by Dhakira Collective and is set to take place from August 13th to the 20th, 2021. It will include screenings of award-winning films by filmmakers from the North African region and its diasporas that explore queer identity and sexuality in North Africa.It will also include workshops, panel discussions as well as a virtual closing party in collaboration with Blush. Dhakira Collective is a Montreal-based archival, curatorial and research platform that foregrounds art and cinema outside the western canon.





Terence is the leader of Young Ontarians United which is a project funded by #RisingYouth to unite youth voices in Ontario regarding the challenges faced due to COVID-19 amidst marginalized groups on the provincial stage. This project served to highlight the youth's voices, their passions and their leadership in the present as well as the future.

Terence's passion towards youth engagement translated to many #RisingYouth projects that he took leadership roles in, such as being a host for the #RisingYouth video capsule series. He conducted interviews with #RisingYouth Alumni and Grantee to showcase and learn of their projects, their passions and what makes them a true community leader. He also facilitated a focus group discussion for Visible Minorities, gathering their feedback on the #RisingYouth program and how to provide better support for the community. Throughout all his engagements, he holds the firm conviction that youth must be authentically engaged in the present democracy, especially in the making of decisions that directly impact their lives.
